
LANPAC ANNUAL REPORT 2019/20











CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The last year has been another busy one for LANPAC, as we continue to support the work of the Lancashire Constabulary.

Not only have we enabled many local officers and support staff to enhance the safety and security of those living and working in their communities, but we have continued to build on the service that we provide for our member organisations.

We believe that by supplying up to date advice and guidance for our members, and by holding free to attend events focusing on specific issues, we can help them to put in place measures which make them less vulnerable to criminal exploitation. We encourage members to bring guests to these events, and this has had the benefit of attracting a number of new applications for membership.

It is pleasing therefore, to report that we have continued to expand our membership, a consequence of which is that we are in a healthy financial position which means that we have been able to support a wide range of initiatives over the course of the year.

The assessment process for new applications is working well and I am grateful to my fellow Directors whose prompt responses allow us to make decisions on funding for the majority of cases within five working days. I know that the Constabulary staff welcome the fact that they can put in place solutions to local problems in their communities in a prompt and effective manner.

Emma Bone, who had been our Co-ordinator for several years moved on to take a position of greater responsibility as the Constabulary's Designing Out Crime Officer, and

we have been delighted to welcome Anna Baybutt who has quickly settled into the vacant position.

In the spring, in partnership with The Police & Crime Commissioner, our Vice-Chairman, Wendy Walker chaired a successful Modern Day Slavery event at the Dunkenhalgh Hotel in Clayton le Moors.

During the early summer of 2019, we at LANPAC were targeted by a criminal gang who made a very sophisticated attempt to access our Bank Account. Fortunately, they were unsuccessful, but it brought home the point very forcibly that no organisation or individual is immune from the attentions of criminals.

In December 2019, we supported a very well attended Crime Prevention Conference for members and their guests at Blackburn Rovers F.C. at Ewood Park, and on that occasion a large number of exhibitors were also present. We have since been working closely with the Constabulary planning a range of further events, but the emergence of the Coronavirus pandemic early in 2020 has forced us to put these on hold until it is safe to do so. In the meantime, we are working hard to explore using the Internet to develop the ways we communicate our messages to the wider community.

So, the year has ended with a great deal of uncertainty, as many aspects of normal life are suspended, and only time will tell what the longer term impact will be. For the future, LANPAC remains open for business and will continue to provide support to our communities across the county.

MANAGER'S REPORT

OVER £3M AWARDED BY LANPAC

The Lancashire Partnership Against Crime (LANPAC) has awarded over £3million to projects across the county that aim to reduce crime, tackle disorder and make our communities safer.

LANPAC supported over 50 initiatives last year - protecting the vulnerable elderly, tackling crime, drug abuse, street robbery and burglary, making people feel safer on the streets and in their homes, as well as providing a wide range of educational services and recreational opportunities to help our young people lead safe, productive lives.

Funding applications are invited throughout the year and are normally considered within 5 working days. We are regularly approached by Neighborhood Policing Teams for financial assistance to support projects identified as priorities by members of their community, and we have been able to act quickly and make a real difference to improve the quality of life for the residents and local communities.

I am firmly of the opinion that each and every project we have supported has played an important part in tackling a specific problem in Lancashire – implementing sustainable solutions to real problems affecting real people in our communities.

Lancashire Constabulary have re-introduced Problem Oriented Policing (POP), which involves the identification and analysis of specific crime and disorder problems, in order to develop effective response strategies. This also means that LANPAC will have a greater role to play in supporting community safety projects and we expect the demand for funding application from officers to increase.
















BENEFITS OF MEMBERSHIP
















PROJECTS FUNDED

A SELECTION OF THE MANY PROJECTS FUNDED BY LANPAC IN 2019/2020

Kirkham Companions

Working in partnership with LANPAC, Fylde Borough Council and the AFC Community Foundation we have offered a two-hour weekly meeting session for local elderly residents who have been identified as socially isolated or vulnerable to being victims of crime. The meetings offer chair- based exercise by qualified instructors, crime prevention information and input from guest speakers all in a relaxed coffee afternoon environment. The group have also enjoyed talks from our Mounted Police and Dog handling departments which went down really well. These groups will continue to run on a weekly basis.

Romance Fraud Awareness

This project is in relation to a prevent advert the Economic Crime Unit put out to Jam Publications Preston magazines in December. Statistics suggest this type of scam is prevalent at that particular time of year and the idea of the poster was to prevent the fraud from taking place.

Bike Coding Cycles

Blackpool and Fylde cadets secured funding from LANPAC to purchase bike coding equipment from Selectamark. They were able to buy 100 kits. Bike coding provides a deterrent for thefts, and hopefully a way of reuniting the owner with their bike if it is ever lost or stolen.

School Drugs Box Talk

PCSO Debby Savage attend a range of yr6 classes giving a two and a half hour talk to each class. This therefore allowed the children to take in a reasonable amount of knowledge which they can take with them on to high school.

I also give talks to small numbers in high schools when the school contact us saying they are having related issues. The box is also used by other colleagues of Debby's as they also do school talks and talks to staff at the hospitals. The box is an asset to the neighborhood policing team, and is used weekly. To make it a fair system we have a booking system so other officers can use the box on their areas.
